She decided to attend school even though she has been married off and girls like her must be helped to fulfill their dreams of a better future through education and implementation of policies that protect them.

This should encourage us as students especially girls to appreciate our opportunities and not let them be pointless. Think about others who don't have the same opportunities we have. Let's be disciplined and hardworking to succeed so we can be good examples to the world that a girl's education is an investment for all now and in the future.


